Stockwell Hall Renovation

In 1940 Stockwell Hall opened as an all female residence and was named after Madelon Louisa Stockwell, the first woman to be admitted to The University of Michigan. Slated for renovations under the \$300 million Residential Life Initiatives program, Stockwell Hall began the \$39.6 million renovations and infrastructure upgrades in May of 2008. On September 4, 2009 the former all female residence, re-opened as a co-ed residence hall housing 402 students.

General Project Scope

Installation of entire HVAC system including; low pressure steam lines, steam condensate, heating hot water, chilled water and chilled water condensate. Plumbing system including all new sanitary and storm piping. Equipment included sinks, faucets, toilet fixtures, drinking fountains, sump pumps, and showers.

Project Duration: 1 Year

Project Cost: \$5.1 Million
